## CWL Constitution & Bylaws (Page 83-86)

- A. The Objects of the League focus on members' principle goal in the introduction.
- O. What is "to unite Catholic women in Canada"?
- A. A Catholic woman wishing to become a CWL member should contact this council level.
- Q. What is parish?
- A. These councils may nominate a life member.
- Q. What are diocesan and provincial councils?
- A. The criteria for this League membership are established by the national executive.
- Q. What is Life Membership?
- A. The category of membership unique for past national presidents.
- Q. What is Honorary Life Membership?
- A. It is the responsibility of this group to direct and administer the affairs of the League.
- Q. Who is the executive? (at all levels)
- A. CWL members who sign a certificate of organization are known by this name.
- Q. What are "charter" members?
- A. This officer is responsible for leadership development.
- Q. Who is the organization standing committee chairperson?
- A. Along with the president and treasurer, this officer is an official signing officer of the League.
- Q. Who is the recording secretary?
- A. This group decides the site of the annual convention.
- Q. What is the executive of the council concerned?
- A. They are the voting delegates of the council assembled in convention.
- Q. Who are the presidents of each council comprising the council?
- A. Only voting delegates may vote on these three questions at an annual convention.
- Q. What are election of officers, amendments to the Constitution & Bylaws, and increases in per capita fees?
- A. It requires a voting delegate to vote according to the instructions of the council represented.
- Q. What is an instructed vote?
- A. The term of office for elected officers.
- Q. What is two years?
- A. An officer, at any level, loses this privilege if she has been removed from office.
